

The music of Chile's Victor Jara taps into that vision in an extraordinary way and his life and work continues to inspire our festival, here in Mid Wales. The setbacks of the last few years have produced major challenges to many people's hopes for

a fairer, more compassionate world. The importance of gathering and drawing inspiration from artists such as Jara is as strong as ever. This year our focus is on Ecuador; a country of incredible diversity and home of one of the true visionary artists of socialism, Oswaldo Guayasamin.

Camping



Quijada



Choose between our Acoustic Evening in the Plas Hall, and the Dance Party in the Marquee - or move between the two as the mood takes you!

At the Acoustic Evening, the wonderful Welsh troubadour **Dafydd Iwan** will be playing between 8.30-9pm. Dafydd is a longtime supporter of the festival and has translated the Victor Jara song, "The Right To Live In Peace", into Welsh.

Others who will be performing include Jim Radford, singing sea shanties and early folk songs along with Nick Jeffrey who will be joining him with songs of Woody Guthrie and the brilliant number "Why We Build The Wall".

Latino melodic folk musicians Rompiendo Fronteras will be singing their beautiful harmonic versions of Latin American ballads, and there will be some lovely Welsh harp music from Cerys Hafana.

In addition you can hear the Welsh singer **Elen Blaney** from Llangollen, as well as a few numbers from **Tony** and **Cristina** and a performance from **El Parcito**, a Chilean duo.

Meanwhile, in the Big Marquee Los Hermanos Millar will be playing. Based around brother and sister Pablo and Ema Millar, the group plays a highly original mix of Latino jazz-folk.

This will be followed by a Cornish Afro-Cuban salsa outfit, Quijada, who will get people on their feet and dancing with their mesmerising rhythms!

Saturday and Sunday

Music, Poetry and Dance performance

Expresion Inka is a dance and music group that offers a fusion of melodies, performance, rhythms, colour and Latin American traditions in London and England. They are artists: children, young people and adults, who for 10 years have been exploring the connections between art and folklore, and the ways in which these are tools to talk about current social issues and inspire change.

Quijada have been playing irresistible Latin sounds since 2009. Cornwall's answer to The Buena Vista Social Club, they will be playing a variety of Afro-Cuban music (both in Spanish and English), from standard Cuban numbers to self-penned songs. Quijada take their name from one of their instruments, an ancient Peruvian percussion device fashioned from a donkey's jawbone.

Juan Carlos Chiriboga is an Ecuadorian musician who plays music from his native land on guitar, charango and quena. His artistry is steeped in the sounds of the Andes and the Latin American 'troyador' tradition.

Blodau Gwylltion are a local Welsh duo who sing folk songs in the Welsh language. Their name means "Wild Flowers".

Cor Gobaith are a local choir who sing songs of protest and social justice. Their name means "Choir of Hope".

Dafydd Iwan is a Welsh folk singer and politician who has campaigned all his life for the Welsh language and who wrote the great Welsh anthem "Yma O Hyd" ("Still Here").

Los Hermanos Millar are a Chilean band from the city of Concepcion in the south. Ema and Pablo are brother and sister, and form the nucleus of the band. Their songs are a tapestry of folk styles, sometimes mixed with jazzy tinges. The band has been together for over 30 years, and over that time has dedicated itself to the study of Latin American traditional music. This work is strongly praised by many artistic organisations in their home country.

ECCO (Ethnic Contemporary Classical Orchestra)

This year we are delighted to have the participation of Musiko Musika and The Ethnic Contemporary Classical Orchestras of London, a community of children and families who perform music from around the world, and use their musical talents and passion to unite people from different backgrounds.

Appearing at El Sueño Existe will be the ECCO @ Lyric ensemble of around 30 children and parents from cultural backgrounds including the Philippines, Iraq, the Caribbean, Bulgaria, Sri Lanka and England, performing a characteristically diverse repertoire with an exuberance and spirit that lifts and inspires audiences.

The young musicians and their parents take an active role in every step of the music-making process – from playing to songwriting and conducting. Founded in 1998 by Mauricio Venegas-Astorga (director of Quimantu, who are also performing at the festival) and Rachel Pantin, Musiko Musika aims to empower children, young people, families and communities to make music and express themselves culturally.

Ouimantu

Quimantu was formed by the outstanding UK based Chilean musician and composer Mauricio Venegas-Astorga, and since then has gained a reputation as one of Britain's finest South American bands. The group has blossomed out of the very particular musical environment that exists in the UK, especially in London, an environment that has afforded Quimantu the opportunity to collaborate with leading musicians from almost every genre imaginable, from Western Classical to Indian Classical, and from African to traditional English Folk. The result is a powerful and inspiring musical message, a refreshing mix full of life and honesty that speaks directly to audiences' hearts as well as their dancing feet. The performance for the festival will feature the wonderful voice of up and coming singer Laura Venegas-Rojas, whose velvet tones are rapidly making her a favourite with audiences here and in Chile.

Music In The Time Of Revolution: Kausary are a Peruvian outfit led by multi-instrumentalist; Johnny Rodriguez and they combine panpipes, salsa, rumba and cha cha cha. Hydrogen Jukebox are an improvising duet that draws on the Beat Generation, Celtic verse, and poems of protest from around the world including Allen Ginsberg's "Howl". Sid Peacock and Steve Tromans are delighted to realise this long held ambition of collaborating with Kausary. We would like to thank Tony Dudley-Evans for enabling this to happen.

Cloud Cuckoo are a Machynlleth-based band who play music inspired by the Chilean New Song movement with a light dusting of whimsical folk. We love playing the Sunday morning slot of the festival; come along and dance into the day.

Los Copihues Rojos take their name from the national flower of Chile. Expect lively cuecas as well as great renditions of songs by Isabel Parra, Victor Herrera and others.

Society Of Imaginary Friends: Described as cinematic, classical and folk in a similar vein to the 'supernatural calm of Antony and the Johnsons', the Society of Imaginary Friends are a 'glorious mix of orchestral, folk melodrama'. Based around the mezzo-soprano voice of Louise Kleboe and accordion and keyboardist Alfie Thomas, they offer 'the kind of surreal beauty that Stanley Kubrick would have given his beard for, a remarkable experience that will leave you in goosebumps.' (Planet Sound, Channel 4). Louise and Alfie are composers of music for film and have worked on award-winning films including McLibel, Age of Stupid, Short Supply and At Dawning, and they are currently writing the score for the beautiful art film Snow People. They performed at the Opening Ceremony of the Green Fields at Glastonbury Festival this year.

La Veleidosa is fronted by the beautiful voice of Maria Bernardita. La Veleidosa is a Chilean band which particularly focuses on the preparation and diffusion of a repertoire of 'cueca', the national dance of Chile, as well as performing 'tonadas' and music of the new Chilean song tradition. One of the foundations of the group's music heritage is the Chilean 'cantora', embodied in the legacy of Violeta Parra and her own research on the rural culture of Chile.

Razz: Also known as the 'Bard Of Tottenham', Razz is a veteran of the festival and a brilliant performance poet. He ran the legendary "World Oyster Club" at Bunjees in London for many years. He will be pitching up for impromptu renditions throughout the festival.

Carlos Arevalo is an Ecuadorian musician from Quito who plays zampoña and quena.



Celebration And Circle Dance: It has become a tradition at the end of the festival for the audience and performers to join together with some inspiring songs that everyone can take part in. This will be followed by a closing circle dance; local circle dance group Dawns Tierra have been playing for circle dances in the Dyfi Valley for many years, and local dancer Claire Jenkins has choreographed dances to many Latin American songs including some by Violeta Parra and Victor Jara.

Open Mic Area

This will be in the Community Garden Hut and will take place from 1pm - 6pm on Saturday afternoon. Come along to sing a song or 3, or recite a poem. Your MCs will be Razz and friends.

Caffi Alys at 73 Maengwyn St will be a venue for Sueno artists from 11am-6pm on the Saturday and 11.30am-3pm on the Sunday. Lovely atmosphere and great food.

Nature Medicine

Nature Ceremony - Alex Etchart is an Anglo-Uruguayan community artist and nature connection worker, supporting marginalised groups and ecological campaigns in doing arts action locally and in territories of conflict.

We will use mind, body and song to reconnect with the land, herstory and the humans around us in an uplifting start to the day.

Pablo Neruda: Passion for Ecuador

Neruda's acclaimed biographer and translator Adam Feinstein talks about the Nobel Prize winning Chilean poet's friendship with Ecuador's greatest painter, Oswaldo Guayasamin, and its two finest poets: Jorge Enrique Adoum and Jorge Carrera Andrade.

Gadael Tir (3 Acres and a Cow)

This is a show that tells the story of land rights and protest in Wales. It follows the trials and tribulations of the common folk who strove to build the nation from the ground up. Gadael Tir tells their story through sing-along choruses of traditional songs; tales of desperation and perseverance; cross-dressing, axe wielding farmers; radical preachers, land workers and unions, across a thousand years of history and squeezed into one performance!

Hispano-American Women Writers on Memory

We are seven women artists whose activities range from writing our own prose, poetry and songs to painting and performing in live events.

We will run a creative workshop where together we will form a Mantle of Hope, a collective collage, with the words and images that arise during the session.

Our performance (with the use of poetry, music and prose, and other Art forms that give us wings) will explore the universal theme 'Woman and Water'. In a performance amalgamating poetry, music and prose, we will celebrate the power of the endlessly flowing Woman, and commemorate women's struggle for water.


